

5. The NEC also noted with dismay the attitudes of Governors of Anambra, Benue, Imo, Kogi, Osun and Oyo States in the manner they are handling the welfare of our members in their respective States.
6. The NEC observed that the current stand-off between Oyo State and the Resident Doctors on the Residency Program of Ladoke Akintola University Teaching Hospital, Ogbomosho in truncating the Residency Program has seriously impacted negatively on patients' care.
7. NEC noted with dismay the efforts to politicize the conduct of the just concluded pre-registration examination for foreign trained Medical Doctors by the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria (MDCN) the statutory body charged with standardization and control of Medical Education in Nigeria. This singular action is capable of threatening the medical profession and poses a great danger to the health of Nigerians.
8. NEC observed with dismay the non constitution of MDCN Governing board and other boards of tertiary health institutions in spite of the numerous calls for the immediate reconstitution of these boards by the NMA.
9. NEC noted the alarming incursion of quacks into the fields of health care provision due to lack of functional councils of various regulatory bodies, lamenting that many patients had been maimed while others had been sent to their graves early.
10. The NEC noted with dismay the disrespect for NMA leadership by Dr. Wapada Balami mni a former first Vice President of NMA.

RESOLUTIONS

1. The NEC calls on the Federal Government to act fast to reverse the current trend of brain drain by improving the capacities and providing more vacancies in our health institutions while improving doctors welfare.
