

2. The NEC urges her members to play active roles in grass root partisan politics in Nigeria.
3. NEC congratulates the Federal Government for bringing Nigeria out of economic recession and calls on the Government to provide an intervention fund at a single digit interest rate to medical entrepreneurs to establish Group Mega Hospitals in order to reduce foreign medical tourism and save foreign exchange for Nigeria.
4. The NEC calls on Oyo State Governor to review his decision on the Residency Program of Ladoke Akintola University Teaching Hospital, Ogbomosho in the interest of the good people of Oyo State. Similar states having disputes with their Medical Doctors are also advised to quickly resolve their differences.
5. The NEC rejects in totality all efforts at politicizing the conduct of pre-registration examination for foreign trained Medical Doctors by the MDCN. It therefore calls on all her members to boycott any plan that are not in the functions of the MDCN.
6. The NEC calls on the Federal Government to urgently reconstitute MDCN in order to checkmate the current challenges facing the Medical Profession.
7. The NEC approves March 31<sup>st</sup> 2018 as the date to commence the universal use of Doctors stamp on all medical correspondences to various institutions.
8. The NEC approves the indefinite suspension of Dr. Wapada Balami, mni and strips him of his recognition and all the privileges attached to him as past first Vice President of NMA.
9. The NEC wishes to congratulate one of her members Professor Titus Ibekwe of University of Abuja for being the first African to be appointed into a 3 man Presidential Steering Committee of American Academy of Otorhinolaryngological Society.
